We are pleased to inform you that New Milford Public Schools will be continuing to participate in a program available to schools participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Programs called the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)**. This program will run through February 28, 2026.

What does this mean for you and your children?

Great news! All enrolled students of New Milford Public Schools are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no cost** to your household each day until February 28, 2026. Your children will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.
